Students outside Auckland will be interested in this Association and with the idea of assisting them to form a like Association in the main centres, we give the following details sent us by the Secretary.

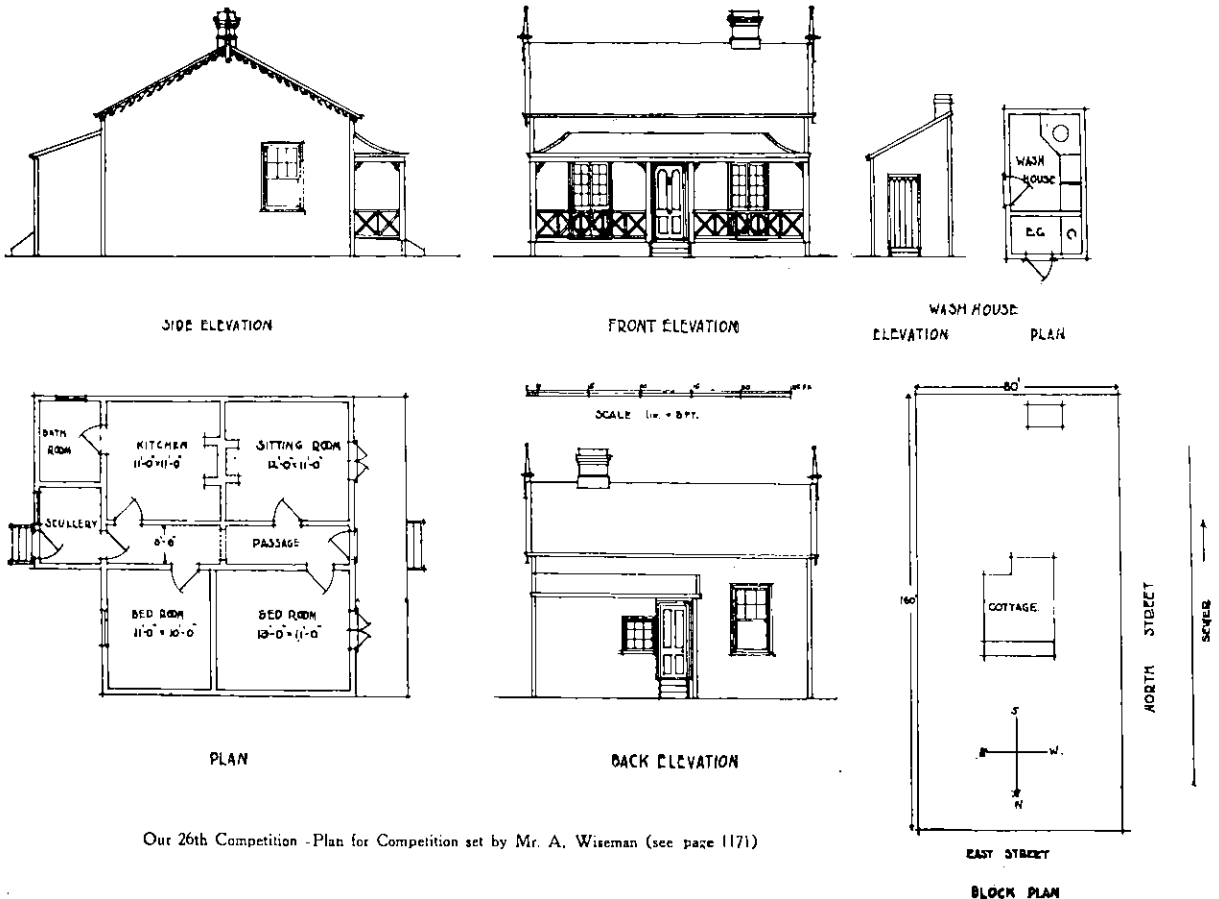
