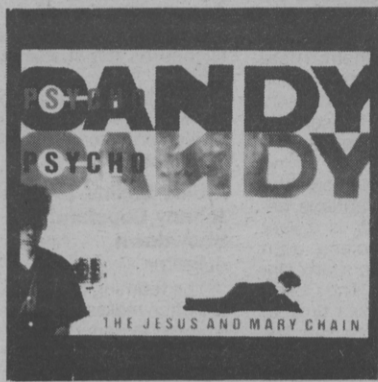

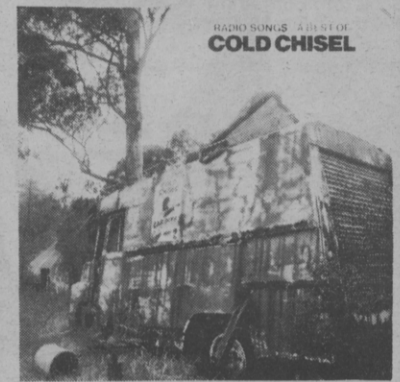
**The Jesus and Mary Chain**

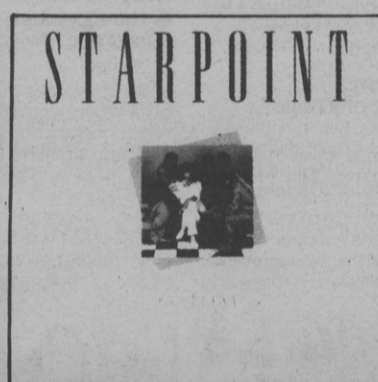
**Cold Chisel**

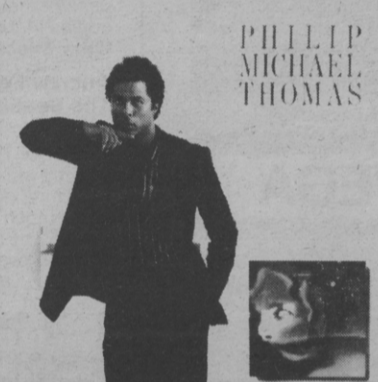
**Krush Groove**

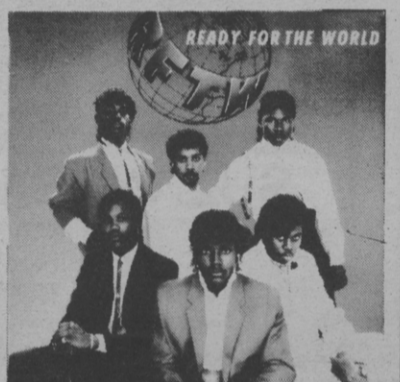
**Atlantic Rhythm & Blues**

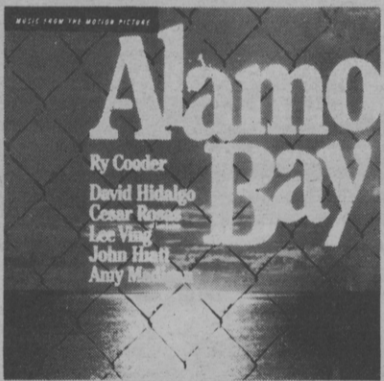
**Starpoint**

One of America's leading funk bands is now on NZ release. The hot dancefloor track is 'Object Of My Desire'.



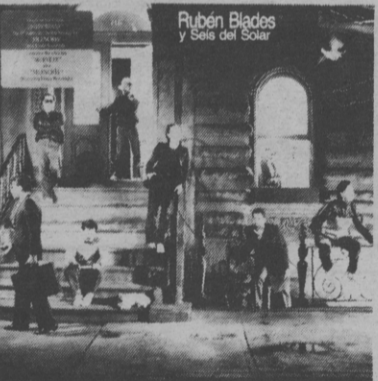
**Phillip-Michael Thomas**

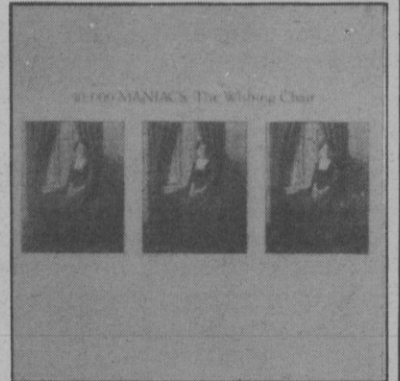
**Ruben Blades**

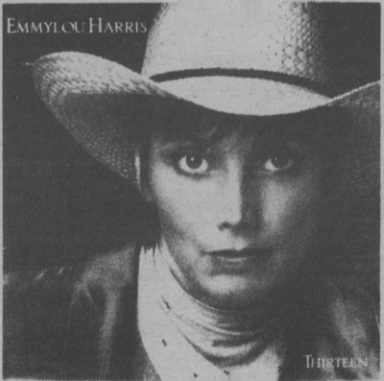
**Phillip Glass**

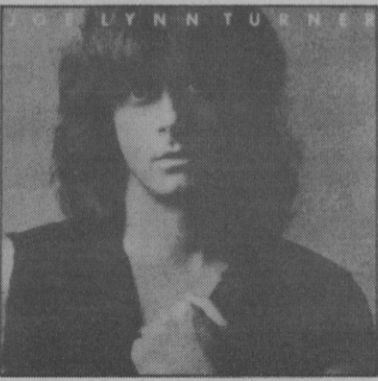
**10,000 Maniacs**

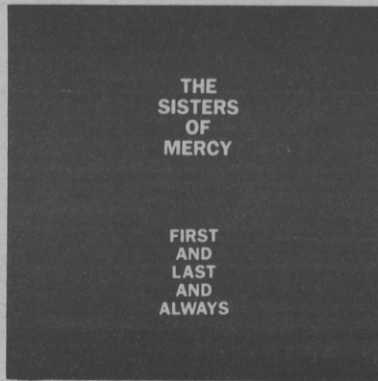
**Emmylou Harris**
