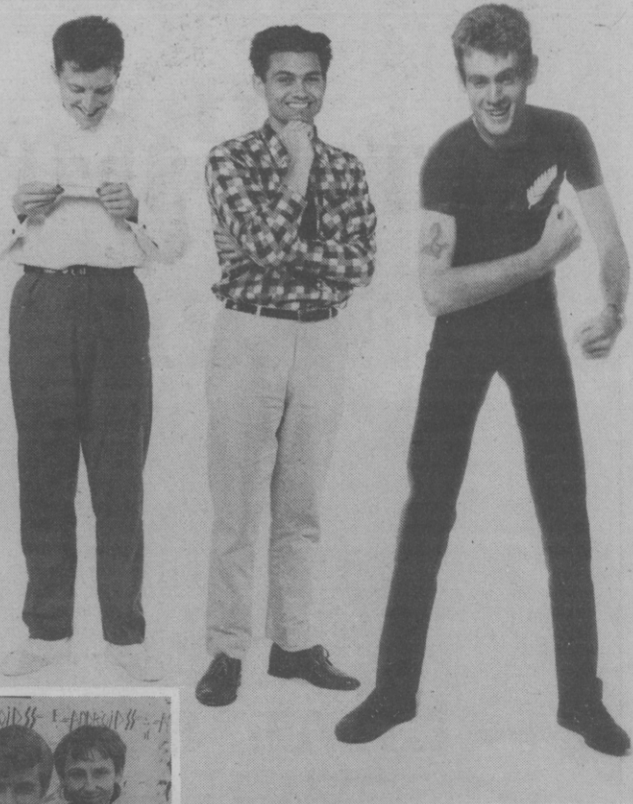


where are they now?

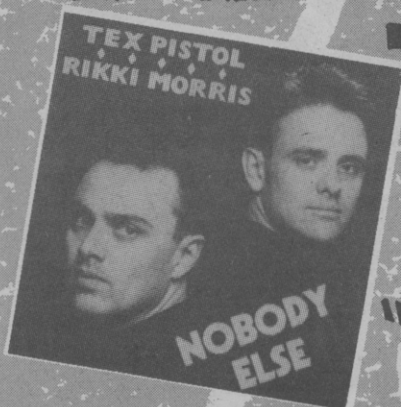
