## OASIS SOAP OPERA

The Gallagher brothers, small guys with attitude, have returned to England after walking out on their USA tour and cancelling their Pacific tour. In Australia alone, 80,000 tickets were refunded.

But whether there's a crisis in the brotherly\* love stakes or whether the pressure of touring has made them both spit the dummy, is not at all clear.

When questioned by reporters in Chicago before their first USA gig Noel was understanding when facing Liam's absence, "You have to support people when they're going through a personal crisis. So, no, I don't feel like slapping him."

Media have sort to identify friction between the brothers, painting Patsy Kensit as a Yoko Ono like figure seeking to destroy Oasis and stories highlight the difference in the Gallaghers' incomes. Noel as chief songwriter collects 70 percent of Oasis royalties. Does Liam want Noel's money. Does Noel want the attention the singer gets?

With their touring cancelled, Noel has made it possible to achieve his mid-year plan to record a new album in October. Maybe the events of the last few weeks were designed just to clear the Gallaghers' calendar of unwanted committments.

• August 24 — Liam is Unplugged for MTV Unplugged at Festival Hall, London. Liam loses it, hunched in a corner, in a foetal position, crying. Once he regained his composure, Llam refused to go on stage. Noel took over the vocals but MTV do not plan to screen the million dollar production. NME found such phrases as "half-cocked" and "debacle" to describe the churlish event.

- August 26 Liam does not board plane to Chicago, leaving Heathrow Airport 15 minutes before the plane's departure to go flat hunting with girlfriend Patsy Kensit. A UK tabloid read, "PATSY'S GOT HIM BY THE WONDERBALLS,"
- August 27 Liam-less Oasis play Chicago. The large signs outside the venue read, "Liam Gallagher is ill and will not perform this evening. Noel Gallagher, song-writer & guitarist/vocalist will be performing all vocals & show will go on. Should you wish a refund, do not enter the building. Return your full untorn ticket to the point of purchase."
- August 29 Liam rejoins the Oasis tour in Detroit. He performs the following night just outside Detroit, then it's on the road, next stop is a Festival near Toronto with Screaming Trees, Gin Blossoms and Neil Young headlining over Oasis.
- September 4 Oasis play MTV Music Awards in New York. Performing 'Champagne Supernova', Liam spat, added "up yer bum" to the lyric and threw a beer can into the audience. There was booing when the song ended. He told a journalist "They're all here for one reason, to see the greatest rock 'n' roll band in the world."
- September 12 Noel returned to London looking shagged. An official statement said the cancellation of the tour was a decision, "taken solely by Noel Gallagher on behalf of his four friends."

OMC single 'How Bizarre' has hit No.1 in Ireland and now sold over 500,000 copies worldwide. Expect a new NZ single 'Land of Plenty' late October. In Australia and the UK the next single is 'On the Run' ... Everclear have recorded the Smiths' 'How Soon Is Now?' for a benefit album for LA club Jabberjaw ... John Lydon walked out on a USA MTV interview after he didn't like Kurt Loder's questions ... Morrissey has signed to the Mercury label ... Blur are

recording a new album in Iceland with producer Stephen Street ... Elvis Costello told LA media that his current tour with the Attractions, may be his last tour. Under the name "The Imposter", Costello has remixed Tricky's new single 'Christiansands'. Tricky's forthcoming album Pre-Millennium was recorded two years ago at Grove Studios in Jamaica ... guests on the new Jon Spencer Blues Explosion album Now I Got Worry include Memphis soul legend Rufus Thomas and Beastie Boys man Money Mark ... Dead Flowers have recorded a new single 'You Drink the Water, I'll Drink the Wine' at Sydney's Darling Harbour Studio, with producer Robbie Rowlands who recently did the Head Like A Hole album ... old-skool rapper Schoolly D is recording a new album in New York assisted by Chuck D ... Paul McCartney has collaborated with Allen Ginsberg to record a version of poet's 'Ballad of the Skeletons' ... the Rolling Stones movie Rock & Roll Circus, that was shelved nearly 30 years ago, will now be released on video ... Filter are releasing a 60 min video Filter, Phenomenology, 1,137 Days on the Short Bus with four live tracks, interviews, doco and two videos ... finally, a charity music biz golf tournament entitled Fairway to Heaven takes place this month in Las Vegas with REM's Mike Mills and Bill Berry, members of Hottie & the Blowfish, Alice Copper and Richie Sambora.
