The thing is, these Chainsaws aren't masochists. Murray Couling confesses that he doesn't even like the movie Texas Chainsaw Massacre and wonders why all these unscary Flying Nun bands have such unsavoury names Headless Chickens, Straitjacket Fits, Dribbling Darts of Love vech! No wonder his workmates in South Auckland were surprised when they heard how accessible 'Thrashing Around' sounded on

That's the debut single from Chainsaw Masochist's debut album, Periphery, which could be described as quietly uneasy listening. Reflective lyrics and guitar tunes created with only a little bit of reverb and a small Marshall stack (the entire stash of band gear is stacked unobtrusively in a corner of Murray's bedroom). No effects to speak of.

"We're more interested in what the two guitars do opposed to each other," says chief songwriter and guitarist Murray. The other members of the band being Debbie Silvey

(guitar, vocals), and brothers Darren and Ricky McShane on bass and drums respectively

Chainsaw Masochist formed three years ago. Six months ago they recorded six songs but were turned down for an Arts Council Grant. They were all set to release an independent LP when Flying Nun came knocking and fronted up with \$2,000 towards the \$7,000 production costs. Understandably, the band were "quite over the top" about the signing, and regard it as a privilege.

Although there's nothing cliched about their songs, which are lovely, Chainsaw Masochist could be considered a quintessential Flying Nun band. Murray is unapologetically uninterested in rap ("the whole rap scene's alien to me. I don't go out clubbing. I don't really like dancing. I've got nothing against rap but I don't buy rap records and I don't listen to it"). Nor is he ashamed to admit that "those cliche alternative bands" are his favorites. That's right — the Pixies and My

Music and are looking for a new record deal . . . the are on tour in Europe . . . a tribute LP to Mother Love group will be called Temple of the Dog . . . George Michael is engaged to marry American model April

Bloody Valentine.

Perhaps people from the South Island are better equipped to fly in the face of fashion. That's where Murray grew up. "All these people grew up and weren't able to absorb themselves in sport or rugby. Most of the Auckland Flying Nun bands like the Headless Chickens or NRA are different." (ie danceable).

With Murray's doleful voice and a cover like 'The Last Waltz' one

would sway, rather than dance, to a Chainsaw Masochist track. But every so often the introspective mood of Periphery fizzes with quitar interference, like a sudden flashing on the line of a heart machine. There's a sting in the tail of some of these songs. Perhaps the photograph of a car wreck on the album cover isn't such a peripheral idea after all DONNA YUZWALK
