Pretty great

As is the SUCKDOG/SMOG split ep (Number One Hits). I was wrong as all hell about Lisa S. the first time (ie when I heard 'Kill Ralf' and went "Oh great, performance art") cos this time she's got a cool record with cute little tunes and shit that even a retard pop fan like me can dig no trouble at all, plus a whole side of stuff by wild BILL SMOG who I already liked cos I'd heard SMOG's 'Floating' ep (Drag City) attractively cheapo recording, direct, honest, no messing, and one of the songs sounds like the And Band or second album Red Krayola, the kind of archaic shit I find myself increasingly drawn to now since Freddy M and Steve Gilpin popped off ... 'nother band that could just about be king is. New York's shit hot, but sorta unassuming and almost too fucking cute LOVE CHILD (self-titled ep on

Trash Flow), named after a Suprem song or what? I also like HOLE's first (I think) single, certainly best of the several things I've heard by them,

'Retard Girl' (Sympathy For The Record Industry), not really unassuming or cute enough for my usual everday listening, but still shit hot, and the most recent TAV FALCO - first I've seen that doesn't go out under the generic Panther Burns nomenclature — 'I Can Help' (yeah, the ol' Billy Swan number) by THE TAV AMD GABBY SHOW (Sympathy likewise). Alan at Flying Nun told me: "This guy's apparently real popular in Christchurch" and I know why that is too, it's cos people there know what's good. 'Scuse me a second, John Farnham's on TV . . . uh yeah, we also got the MINOR THREAT 'Live At Buff Hall' ep (Lost and Found) — gee, I dunno, HC was never exactly my bag, most least of all DC HC with all that no booze/no dope shit...right now I'm drunk on my ass and it's hard to imagine life, let alone this record, being tolerable any other way. could recommend it to people that saw and liked Fugazi when they came here and who don't know what lan MacKaye was doing 10 years ago and wanna find out . . . Good luck.
