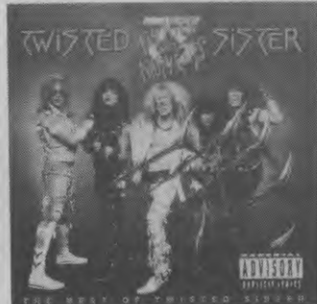


THE JESUS & MARY CHAIN

The first brash step into the 90s by William and Jim Reid. The new album was recorded with a full band, giving the music a looser and more organic feel. First single is Reverence. Other key songs are Far Gone and Out plus Almost Gold. Their most powerful album to date.

Collection (Best 81-91)

Ireland's finest has 20 of his great songs, enjoyed on his recent tour, here on this collection of his recordings 1981 to 1991. Tracks include Voyage, Lisdoonvara, Biko Drum, Ordinary Man, Mystic Lipstick, Don't Forget Your Shovel, Lakes of Pontchartrain etc.



THEY MIGHT BE GIANTS
Apollo 18

This astounding duo are back with another musical voyage — 18 tracks of wit and wisdom — music for the 90s. Crucial gems include Dig My Grave, The Statue Got Me High, The Lion Sleeps Tonight, Hypnotist of Ladies, She's Actual Size and If I Wasn't Shy.



IAN McCULLOCH
Mysterio

The second solo release from the former mainman for Echo & the Bunnymen. Ten anthemic new originals plus his sparkling cover of Leonard Cohen's 'Lover Lover'. Anton Corbijn (U2 Depeche Mode) is shooting a video for this song. Try 'Honeydrip', 'Magical World'.



BONNIE RAITT
Collection (20 Best Of)

After her phenomenal concert tour with critics searching for superlatives — here's a collection of Bonnie Raitt's 20 classic tracks including duets with Sippie Wallace and John Prine and Love Me Like A Man, No way to Treat a Lady, (Goin') Wild For You Baby, Finest Lovin' Man etc.

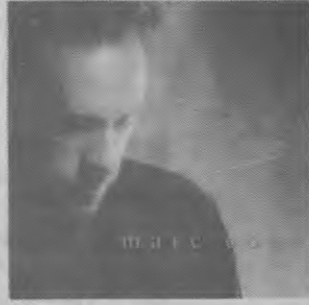
CUBA CLASSICS 2

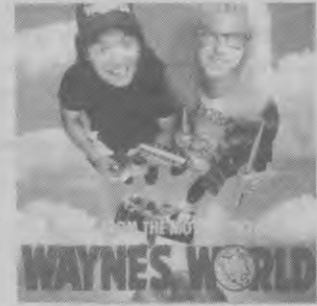
MARC COHN

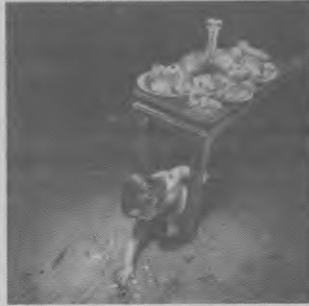
THE JUDYBATS

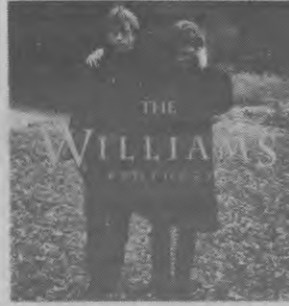
KING'S X

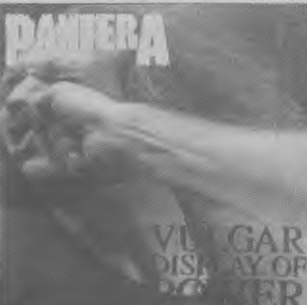
THE WILLIAMS BROTHERS
The Williams Brothers

Pop heaven in twin bothers related to the evergreen Andy Williams and produced here by three legendary producers — Eurythmics' Dave Stewart, Peter Asher and David Kershenbaum (Joe Jackson, Tracy Chapman). An album of refreshing sincerity and directness — a rare harmony, inspiring to hear.



CAMEO
Emotional Violence

The funk legends of 'Word Up' are back with a tougher than ever street funk sound on 'Emotional Violence', the title track. Back in the band is Charlie Singleton and of course Larry Blackmon is up front. Cool tracks are Money, Raw But Tasty and Don't Crash.



PANTERA
Vulgar Display of Power

These hardcore rockers follow up their Cowboys From Hell album with more angry tattoo rock such as 'Be Demons Be Driven', 'Mouth for War' and 'Fucking Hostile'. Power metal music from the hard gigging, hard rockin' crew from Hell. Produced by Terry Date (Soundgarden, Mother Love Bone).



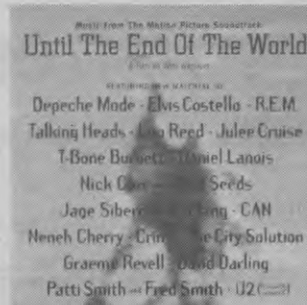
DAVID BYRNE
Uh-oh

The all-around Renaissance man of Talking Heads is back with his first solo album since 1989's 'Rei Momo'. Twelve new songs that are both playful & profound. Although the Latin vibe is still in effect here, the overall feel is accessible and not far removed from mid 80s Talking Heads. Byrne at his best.



LITTLE VILLAGE
Little Village

An amazing meeting of rock legends — Ry Cooder, John Hiatt, Nick Lowe and Jim Keltner — producing real rock & roll firepower. Try out 'She Runs Hot', 'The Action' and the ode to the study bald spot, 'Solar Sex Panel'. A classic, cool rock collaboration!



VARIOUS ARTISTS
Until End of the World

This 19 track album is a remarkable collection of music, from U2's title track to the new tracks by artists such as Lou Reed, Patti Smith, Nick Cave, R.E.M., Talking Heads, Neneh Cherry, Depeche Mode, Julee Cruise (with David Lynch, spooky version of an Elvis Presley song), Elvis Costello doing the Kinks' 'Days' and a collaboration K.D.Laing and Jane Siberry etc. Brilliant!



LOU REED
Magic & Loss

An ambitious and heartfelt album from an artist who has been at the forefront of modern culture from his days in Velvet underground to his more recent work such as New York and Songs for Drella (with John Cale). This album is Reed's response to the death of two close friends — expect unflinching candour, poetic insight and black humour. Masterful tracks include 'What's Good', 'Power & Glory', 'Sword of Damocles'.
