pretty noisey, but a lot more polished. Like LOS, they have the perfect blend of hooks and toughness (not many local acts would be sampling Megadeth, but Rough Opinion did it well) along with a great visual presence. Rough Opinion are a bit more locally orientated — from their look to their raps, RO do the brown and proud thing and do it well. Watch out for them.

Last up were the local equivalent to the Commitments with better noises and their own songs! Supergroove. By now you've read dozens of reviews and probably seen them live as they've just toured, so there's not much I can add except that this time they rocked out a bit more, which was cool, although they still seem to mistake slap bass for funk, but that certainly doesn't stop crowds loving them and everyone having a good time. If you missed them this tour, definitely catch them next

The Psycho Daizies main angle used to be crass metallic hammerings of '60s garage-punk "classics" that annoyed me as much as most contemporary bands' tampering with such material, but these days they have more of a 70s-punk / HM matrix ("progressed" I guess) and a whole bunch of "original" (ie anything but) material shaped to fit. Fact that they are the only band on the scene with the good taste (I guess you'd call it) to cover a Dictators song oughta be some indication of where they're at right now ... Anyway it added up to the 1st time I've seen 'em that I really dug 'em, and I never much thought I would. Considering too that SMAK had already run thru most of the same bag of tricks, yep, pretty slick.


