If you like the I Love Lucy reruns on TV then you must see THE MAMBO KINGS. Two Cubans, played by Armand Assante and Antonio Banderas come to New York in the 50s at the height of the Mambo craze. NEW JACK CITY The multitalented Mario Van Peebles directs and stars in this effective action film chronicling the effects of the drug Crack and how the power and mo' money corrupts the dealers. Wesley Snipes plays the "New Jack" drug lord Nino Brown and, in a strange bit of casting, rapper Ice I plays the cop out to get him. A great film that gets the Black Urban Experience right, albeit by reverting to stereotype at times.

HOT SHOTS! Charlie Sheen stars as Topper Harley, ace fighter pilot with an attitude. He joins a crack team of pilots brought together for a top secret mission. Put together by the makers of Flying High and Naked Gun this is an obvious send up of Top Gun—and a zillion others.

HARDWARE Still showing at one Auckland theatre, Hardware is a Terminator-meets-Alien type of film, but on a smaller buget. The film is a battle of survival as various humans fight against Mach 13, a droid programmed to kill humans as part of a population control scheme. The violent action goes right to the edge, giving this film an R18 rating.

THE GRIFTERS This is a mustsee. Based on Jim Thompsons
novel this is a tale about con
artists - Grifters. Angelica
Huston is Lily, the master of the
con, with John Cussack as her
son Roy. Together with his
girlfriend Myra (Annette

KING RALPH Fans of TV's Roseanne will enjoy John Goodman as Ralph Jones, who becomes next in line when the entire Royal Family is wiped out in a freak accident. Being the American good ol' boy he is, King Ralph possesses none of the tact, diplomacy, and restraint required for a successful monarch.
