


original soundtrack

dirt



Featured on the SINGLES soundtrack, but here with their third album Screaming Trees blasted out of the American Northwest as one of the premiere angry garage bands. Produced by Don Fleming an ex-Dinosaur Jr member who also produced Teenage Fanclub. Screaming Trees have musical qualities rarely found in a band that's been riding the crest of huge underground alternative success. These musical qualities express the good, the bad and the ugly of today — packed with the raw punch of soul and passion that stands alone.

in the beginning

This album is the beginning of one of the greatest blues players that the world has ever known, before his silk kimonos and black sombreros became trademarks, before his incendiary Montreaux Jazz Festival appearances, before his first recording contract, before his studio stint with David Bowle. Listen to the guitarist who ignites. IN THE BEGINNING reveals that Stevie Vaughan did not grow up in public — he emerged full-blown, as essentially the same artist who played his last solos alongside Eric Clapton, Buddy Guy, Robert Cray and Jimmie Vaughan on August 27, 1990.
