
Mountain Rock

Bono's duet with Frank Sinatra will be on the B-side of the new U2 single 'Stay' . . . the Morrissey album Vauxhall And I has been put back to February release due to artwork delays...the Wedding Present are expected to sign to Island Records despite departure of Keith Gregory . . . rumoured opening act for U2 in Australasia is B.A.D. The Australian Musicians's Union is upset that there is no Australian support act.
