Frenzy New Year's Eve Special: NZ On Air funded Frenzy Kiwi music show, is off air for two weeks for the cricket but returns Thursday Dec 23 with a Women's Music special, screening at the usual 11pm on TV3 will broadcast a two hour New Year's Eve special from 11.30pm on TV3 featuring the best video clips of 1993 and some fabulous old classics. Frenzy will be on air every Thursday night in January, February and March.

**NuuFM**: Auckland has a new radio station on **90.2FM** masterminded by Radio Hauraki founder **David Gapes** and broadcasting on the old Fine Music frequency from the IBC "battery hen house" in New North Road. *RipItUp* spoke to programmer **Russell Kerr** about NuuFM.

Format?"We're not looking for a consistent format. We don't want to format it so it sounds the same all day. We play everything from classical to alternative, country, jazz. If it's new we'll play it.

Campus Radio? "I don't see us in competition with student radio because we play the commercial edge of new music. I don't think commercial radio can do alternative as well as student radio?"

Kiwi Music? "We don't like the way commercial radio don't play our own New Zealand artists. We're playing about 25% — Moana, Hallelujah Picassos, Annie Crummer, Strawpeople, Supergroove, Matty J, Dead Flowers, Dave Dobbyn, Emma Paki etc. We're playing a lot of album tracks too."

Top 40? "Auckland has 23 radio stations but hasn't had a station that plays Top 40 and new music. 35 songs on our A-rotate are Top 40."

Max! Auckland's music video Channel Max! is now broadcasting on UHF programme 57 from Brown's Bay as well as 49. The new transmitter at Brown's Bay will improve reception on the North Shore, Parnell and the Eastern Suburbs. Max! is being simulcast on NuuFM Saturday and Sunday nights from 6pm to 1am, including NZone, the 60 minute Kiwi music shows, Saturdays on Max! hosted by Sheryl Morris.

CRY TV was New Zealand's first UHF music video channel and it is now beaming into Christchurch from 11am daily, replaying the previous evening's broadcast up to 4pm when the evening's live programme commences. An attitudinal survey completed by Simply Marketing suggests CRY TV has a weekly cume audience of approximately 47,000 under 35 year olds. Further info ph (03) 339-009.
