

for whom Gullick had written a fine tribute as 'one of his best friends and who knows more about his writing than Sir Edmund himself'.<sup>32</sup> Gullick attempted a Bibliography, and apparently failed; he left no statement about Gosse, apart from the Introduction to the Bibliography and an appreciation of him which he sent over to the Literary Group already mentioned. But a critical appraisal of Gosse needs to be made, and Gullick's collection and bibliographical data would form a valuable foundation for such a study.
