 **New Zealand Maoris**
You can only choose the type of roll you wish to be on between April 7 and June 6, 1986. Your next choice won't be until 1991.

 If you haven't received a roll revision card in the mail, you'll need to complete an enrolment form. Simply pick one up from any Post Office, fill it in while you are there and hand it back.

18 If you've turned 18 you have the right to vote. But first, you must enrol. All you have to do is go to any Post Office and pick up an enrolment form. Fill it in while you are there and hand it back. It's that easy.

 If you've shifted house and you don't receive your roll revision card, simply go to any Post Office and tell them.

 The law states that every person 18 years and over must be on an electoral roll, even if they do not wish to vote. If you don't complete a roll revision card, or fill in an enrolment form, your name will **not** be on the new electoral roll.
