In my last address to Synod I outlined a scheme which seemed to me to be more workable and satisfactory, and I particularly emphasized two principles, viz., that the Bishop of the Diocese should be exofficio a member of the Nomination Board, and that the Vestries sent Parochial Nominators.

The main features of the new Canon are as follows :--

- (1.) In each Diocese there will be a Board of Nomination, consisting of the Bishop of the Diocese (exofficio) and two other members, the one a clergyman in Priest's orders holding the Bishop's License, and the other a Communicant layman resident in the Diocese.
- (2.) The clergyman and the layman will be elected at the first session of each Diocesan Synod. The clergy will elect their representative, and the laity their's. electors will act as an electoral body, and not as the Diocesan Synod, as is already done in the election of General Synod representatives.
- (3.) Whenever a vacancy shall occur in a Parish, the members of the Nomination Board will meet the Vestry of the Parish in Conference in order to consider the filling up of the vacancy.
