

The "Church Times," speaking of the attitude of Anglo-Catholics towards the Reformation, says:—"So far as it meant the repudiation of a one-sided development whereby the legitimate Primacy of the only apostolic see of the West had become converted into an oppressive monarchy, the abolition of specifically mediaeval corruptions, whether in teaching or morals, the translation of the Liturgy into the vernacular, the restoration

of the chalice to the lay-folk, the suppression of bogus relics, pardons, and superstitious accretions generally, we venture to say that the great mass of Anglo-Catholics not merely admits but asserts "the legitimacy of the original Reformation." So far as the Reformation was iconoclastic and destructive in character, so far as it tended to subject the Church to the State, to make the Bride of Christ the handmaid of unscrupulous poli-

ticians, so far as it tended to uproot the habit of worship and devotion in the minds of the people and to divorce them from the use of the Sacraments, in so far we reject and repudiate it." The Rev.
