Conference Against Alcoholism. Will be there only three days, as engagements prevent my being there through the whole Convention. Had to cancel some dates to do that, but felt I could not afford to miss the entire Conference, it is to be a great occasion. From there I go to Minneapoils to the National Convention, and then back to Pennsylvania to fill three weeks' lecture engagements, and then I begin a round of State Conventions, which will bring me up to the last of November."

A letter to Mrs Cooke, Auckland President, gives further particulars. "Then I had to raise the 15,000 dollars for maintenance, and I have half that subscribed. Not long since I was going to speak at a District Rally in Canton. I have been going to Canton and speaking for the cause for 15 years, but the rich man of the town I had not met. He is quite old, and I think does not go out at night often. But at this meeting I was to speak in the day. I woke up the night before thinking of the main-tenance fund, and got up and knelt and asked God to send this man to Rowntree, Bealey Avenue, Christ-church; Sec., Mrs H. R. Smith, Woodville Street, St. Alban's, Christmy meeting the next day, and when I walked into the hall he was there. I asked for an introduction, and then told him about our gift and the money I had to raise, and asked him for 1.000 dollars which he willingly gave me. Yet, some people do not believe that God hears and answers prayer. I hope to get the whole 15,000 dollars subscribed during my vacation.

I read the White Ribbon with the greatest interest and pleasure. It is a fine paper, and I just love it. So sorry to see in one issue of the death of my beloved friend, Mr Broad, and also of Miss Ruth Atkinson; both were so very lovely to me. Give my love to all the blessed White Ribbon sisterhood."
