Frances Willard said to the Unions, "Do Everything." I ask you to do this.

And sisters, while we remember the wastage of precious child life that goes on in our midst through drink, and while we realise the terrible menace that alcohol is to the highest and best interests of our young men and women at this very moment, let us this year remove the charge against us, that in thirty-five years of enfranchised womanhood we have failed to banish the Liquor Traffic from New Zealand.—Yours for service,

BIBLE IN SCHOOLS.

A CALL TO PRAYER AND ACTION.

During the active campaign going on throughout New Zealand for the restoration of the Bible to the primary schools, let us get to prayer, dear sisters. Secretaries asking that meetings be arranged as near as possible to May 29th, when a big demonstration was to be held in the Auckland Town Hall, I would like to state it was in full concurrence with the Organising Secretary of the Bible in Schools League, who greatly desires that at the ordinary W.C.T.U. meeting, or a special meeting to further the Bible in schools cause, the following resolution be put to the people:-

"This meeting views as inadequate the present system of education. because its entirely secular principle is a menace to moral and religious welfare, a danger to the State, and an injustice to the It therefore demands child. from Parliament the restoration of the Bible to the primary While prepared to schools. grant to Committees the right to continue the Nelson system wherever it may be at present operating, it views as inadequate any system that does not place the Bible in the school curriculum and cannot be applied to all the primary schools of the Dominion."

You will see in the May number of the "White Ribbon" the places, dates, and speakers for meetings already arranged. The opportunity of service to the children of New Zealand—who cannot help themseleves—is with us. Let us all grasp it and restore the Bible to its rightful place, viz., in the primary schools of New Zealand.
