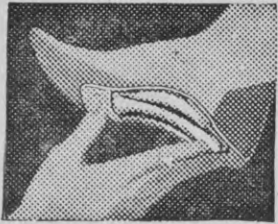

**The
 Passing
 of a
 Great
 Leader &
 Statesman**



**The
 Right Hon.
 M. J. Savage**

The passing of the Rt. Hon. Michael Joseph Savage, Prime Minister of New Zealand, was marked by the profound sympathy of all ranks of the New Zealand Expeditionary Forces both here and overseas.

The late Prime Minister had endeared himself to the hearts and welfare of soldiers and civilians alike, and unprecedented tributes from all parts of the world, including special messages from His Majesty the King and Empire statesmen eulogising the many sterling qualities of our great leader are but reminders of our great loss.

The respect of the entire community was manifested by the quiet dignity and solemnity of subsequent proceedings from the lying-in-state at Parliament Buildings to the final obsequies at the graveside.

The departure of the first echelon for overseas was one of the last occasions upon which the late Prime Minister appeared in public and those who were privileged to witness the event were greatly impressed by the inspiration and thoughtfulness of a great leader for the welfare of all soldiers serving the cause of freedom and of his determination to honour and respect the rights of the fighting forces until all were rehabilitated in a civil capacity when peace and order are to be restored.

At the very outset of hostilities Mr. Savage was first to join the cause of the Allies by declaring war on Germany on behalf of the Government of New Zealand and by vigorous pursuance of that aim has established a worthy precedent for those entrusted to continue his efforts. The rates of pay, transport facilities, modern exploitation of our war efforts, and the appreciative amenities of military camps, reflect upon the efficiency and thoroughness of Mr. Savage's organisation, and Maori and pakeha soldiers alike condone in the many tributes in respect of a great leader.
