**LIFE IN EGYPT**

Letter from Wellington  
Tramwayman

**WINNER OF ANZAC CUP**

At a boxing tournament promoted  
among the Australian and New Zea-  
land soldiers in Egypt some weeks  
ago the splendid Anzac Cup, presented  
by Major-General Freyberg for the  
featherweight championship, was won  
by Cyril Hurne-Miller, formerly a  
conductor of the Wellington tramway  
service. He writes that the occasion  
was such that Australian competi-  
tors were flown from Palestine to take  
part.

"This is a great country, in places,"  
he writes, "but it has some pretty  
awful spots. I have never seen such  
poverty in my life. Little children  
four years of age work all night to  
try and get enough cash so they may  
eat, and they would do anything for  
money. All our food refuse is taken  
away by some firm and sold to these  
poor people, which makes me remark  
that the people of New Zealand do  
not know they are alive.

"You should see the tramcars here.  
They are dirty and pretty slow.  
There are no tramsheds as we know  
them, and, as it very seldom rains  
they don't trouble to cover the cars  
up at all.

"The flies are the greatest pests.  
They are everywhere. You eat about  
a dozen a day, but get used to them  
after a while. The heat is terrific,  
but all the same it is very cold at  
night. My job in this army is run-  
ner for the D.H.Q., and I get plenty  
of running to do. A great time here  
once a week is pay day. We draw  
our pay, then go off to Cairo and have  
a glorious time, and finish up back  
in camp stoney broke for the rest of  
the week. There is lots of fun in  
camp of an evening, singing and  
kicking up a lot of row."

Tramwaymen in the army in Egypt  
speak of the parcels from New Zea-  
land as "manna from heaven," and  
one of them, saturated with perspira-  
tion as he wrote, said he would "never  
moan about a southerly in Wellin-  
ton again."
