

Zealand student, apart from a grounding in the basic principles of wool classing. The long-term development of the facilities for instruction at Massey College gives it an advantage over the Sydney College as far as New Zealanders are concerned, while an additional factor in its favour is that arrangements are being made for brokers to set the examination in wool classing, with the result that a senior certificate gained after a course at Massey College will carry weight with experienced men in the trade.

Official statements have made it clear that it is not the general policy of the Rehabilitation Board in New Zealand as a rule to award overseas bursaries if corresponding facilities are available in the Dominion. It is therefore most unlikely, assuming that an applicant desires to apply the results of his training to New Zealand conditions, that an overseas bursary for such a purpose will be granted. One application on these lines has, in fact, been rejected.

In addition to men attracted by wool classing as a prospective future occupation, there are many soldier-farmers to whom the idea of acquiring a useful working knowledge of an important off-shoot of their calling appeals, not only from the point of view of possible savings in overhead at a later date—for the usual alternative facing a sheepfarmer is either to employ a qualified classer in his shed or to have his clip reclassified by the broker—but also in the breeding and culling of their flocks. That such foresight is fairly widespread is indicated by the interest displayed in the courses on wool classing made available on application by ERS.

Wool classing offers an attractive field for postwar employment, and it has the added security of being based on the foundations of New Zealand's foremost primary industry. But it is unwise not to take into account any disadvantages it may not always be possible to overcome; and that between-seasons interval is one of them.

ORDER OF SUCCESSION

The Duke of Gloucester and his son.

Prince Olav of Norway and his children.

The children of the second daughter of the late Duke of Saxe-Coburg (his eldest daughter, the late Queen Marie of Rumania, having formally renounced on her marriage all possibility

of claim to the British Throne).

The third daughter of the Duke of Saxe-Coburg (Princess Alexandra of Hohenlobe-Langenburg) and her children.

The children of the daughter of the late Duke of Connaught (Princess Margaret of Sweden).

The Duke of Connaught's daughter (Lady Patricia Ramsay) and her son.

The Princess Alice, Countess of Athlone, and her daughter.

This exhausts the families of all Queen Victoria's sons, and the line of succession then continues through her daughters, beginning with the house of the late Empress Frederick.
