ALLIED N. Y. D. RACING CLUB.

1. There shall be six wooden horses used in each race.
2. The horses shall be numbered one (1) to six (6).
3. Three dice shall be used. The "Starter" making one complete throw for each move of the horses. The horses will move in accordance with the numbers turning up on the throw of the dice. E.G. Three, four and five turning up on the dice, horses three, four and five move one space forward.
4. Should two or more horses reach the "winning post" on the same throw of the dice, the dice shall be thrown until one horse, of the horses at the "winning post," has a complete lead of one square. A horse has not "passed the post" until it has advanced one space past the finishing line. Horses other than those at the "winning

post" when the above described situation occurs, will not move on the throw of the dice.

5. In Hurdle Races a double number must be thrown before a horse may clear a hurdle. E.G. If a double five (5) is thrown, and number five (5) is waiting at the hurdle, then number five (5) moves over the hurdle, that is move one space.

6. The "Tote" will pay to the nearest quarter dollar below the actual dividend.

7. No late dividends will be paid. All money must be collected before the following race, and twenty minutes after the last race.

8. The Judge's decision will be final, and "payout" will not commence until "numbers go up".

9. Meetings will be held when the "Spirit" prompts the Club to do

so.

NOTES.

A great field lines up at the barrier tonight, and some big money should be lost. Here are a few notes on the breedings of the big money nags tonight.

FREEDOM - a horse with a long record. Take the Sire, Prosperity. This horse is the favourite of all the Touts from coast to coast. Prosperity, you will remember, is out of **ROUND THE CORNER**, a DAME that was very keen on the Sire, **EQUALITY OF SACRIFICE**. IN the 30's in N.Z. both these nags were the favourite of that great Statesman, George Forbes. a great figure in the Labour Movement.

ANOTHER good nag in the **VOJKA HANDICAP** is **AMBITION**, out of **LIQUIDATED CAPITALISTS**. This DAME is out of **SMALL SHOPKEEPERS**, and the Sire was **BANKRUPTCY**, also very popular in the 30's in N.Z. **COMRADES**, the Sire, is not very well appreciated in Stock Exchange circles.

WAITEMATA - this horse is not seen very often outside of its home town. Sire by **PREFERENCION**, which is still a favourite with **ENGINEERS**, and the DAME, **NEW ZEALAND**, is some distance from this course. OWNER A hot favourite with Sappers, she is now being forgotten

HOT favourite for the race is **BUGRINOFF**. The only horse with a distinctively Russian name and background. It is by **HITLER**, out of **RUSSIA**. The Sire went mad in the early forties and hanged himself on the hammer and sickle.

IN the **Vin Rouge** race there are some good triers. The most sensational entry is **DISCOVERY**, about whom very little is known. Out of **SEPTIC TANK**, which has produced many winners, and Sired by **INTERPRETER**, who tells very little, racing fans can expect something worth while. OWNER Lieut. Torrie keeps a close guard over his find.

OWNER **BLUCK'S CONCRETE**, is another popular filly that looks good at the starting post; she has a Sire, **BARROW**, who always stood the distance. **HAPPY DAYS**, is out of **BROWN BOTTLE**, one of the most levable mokes men ever followed. Be on it. If it does not win, it will try.

CABLE, From Mantague Norman,

OWNER **LOWE**, has been dosing his horse, **HAPPY ENDING**, with flea powder and expects great things.

IN the big race, the **CHINA TEACUP**, **SNAPU**, that horse which made such a great run in the National Hunt Club, will be a trier again. OWNER **SUDMAN**, when asked what the name meant said he would spill the bean when there were no Waacs around. **PASSING** the Buck is one of the best known horses in **NEWCASTLE**. There is not a man in uniform who has not seen or heard of the nobby. **AH SUP**, owned by "TIRED" **NORTON**, will be a trier. **TITBIT**, is a Flashy young thing, she will give trouble at the barrier.

BALLOPING JACKASS will probably beat the barrier. Owner **Watzelberg**, advises punters to back heavy and use **YELLOW DEVIL** as a saver.

JUST MARRIED is an old favourite that is more dead than alive, and if the track is very heavy, may pass out half way. **SKITTLED**, is liable to do the scene at the run home. **HAGGIS**, a temperamental celt, may refuse to budge at the start if insufficient funds on to make the journey worth while.

McKINELY'S FLAT TIME, will be a slow racer, and if other horses meet with accidents this horse should win. Back it on off chance. **GRAND MUSIC** has a good a chance as any; the way **QM. SUTHERLAND**, part owner has been stinting the Sgts. "less to give this nag a good chance, calls for Royal Commission. **KANAKAS DELIGHT** is colourful and with plenty of cheering from the owners box may make the grade. Should run second. **TINNED TURKEY** will be heavily bandaged and boosted along with Vitamin pills.
