arrangements have been completed by which sappers with three sonths or more service overseas may apply for leave to New Zealand. The sapper desirous of this doubtful privilege (after all, home was never like this) may apply for same at their unit orderly room for the regainite forms pertaining to above and the aforesaid privilege. Procedure to be followed is set out below.

(1) Personnel must present themselves completely equipped with meb, rifle, steel helmet, respirator and paybook at 0900 hrs on the Monday first preceding the last Sunday of the month on or

after which the required leave was considered overdue.

(2) On receipt of form TB4YX it must be filled in with green or blue ink on one side of the paper only. It will be necessary to procure one bottle of ink per medium of form XA5S or if one ink

is supplied form 607TR need only be filled in.

(3) After filling in all previously mentioned forms then obtain form TB/s/3//('s36 which after filling in may be sent with the ink bottle (empty) to B.O.D. With this must be sent the cork for which you will duly receive form KIJY678/9 which enables immediate application for permission to forward your original forms to the corporal in charge of your section.

(4) The corporal will in due time pass it on to the sergeant of the orderly room and is recorded in the IN Files, OUT Files, War

Diary and To Be Brought Up Files.

(5) The sergeant will then pass the forms on to the adjutant. He, after due consideration, will pass them to the CC. for consideration and report as to the sappers position.

(6) The OC will proceed as per army regulations (see page 78 of

TRAVE-HOW, WHEN, WHO. ) and move through the usual channels.

(7) The applicant will now apply for form 76/67/76/67 procurable from Base Records, Wellington, and by filling in this form obtain schedule 666 pertaining to regulations re leave.
